approached regarding our needs! We all really appreciate your support in securing us a place at the Santa Rosa Druids Hall on College Ave. in Santa Rosa.





Ask the Grand Secretary...

If you are a member of the Grand Circle Hospitalization Fund... just a reminder emergency room visits are not covered. We do cover inpatient care including rehab up to the limits of the plan, but not long term care facilities. Also covered are prescheduled outpatient procedures (those requiring more intensive treatments) and surgeries. And to answer a question, we also do not cover tests such as CT scans, bone density or mammograms that do not required special preparation.

Of course, if you have special circumstances you may appeal to the Grand Arch Druid.
